Four Things about Vessels

- **A. You are nothing more than a clay vessel.** (Jeremiah 18: 4, II Corinthians 4:7)
 - 4. What is a vessel? What is its purpose?
 - 5. What is the significance of us being vessels in God's hands?
 - 6. In order for us to be available to serve God's purposes, what must we do?
- **B.** You are a vessel chosen according to God's plan. (Acts 9:15, Romans 9:20-22)
 - 7. What is God's definition of success?
 - 8. You have been chosen by God to fulfill a specific purpose. Do you know what that is?
 - 9. What does the moving wheel (that is used to shape the clay) symbolize?
- C. The Holy Spirit will shape and mold you if you let Him. (Isaiah 44:1-4)
 - 10. What is the role of the Holy Spirit as symbolized by the water a potter uses to soften the clay?
 - 11. How can you be more yielded to the Holy Spirit?
- **D.** You have a choice to become a vessel of honor or a vessel of dishonor. (2 Timothy 2:20)
 - 12. What are some things you need to do to become a vessel of honor?
