SERMON REFLECTIONS

- 1. What was the "work method" that Miles observed in the Genesis account? (**Genesis 1**) Share some things that God has been saying to you and then to use this formula for accountability. (Does everyone have an accountability partner? If not, get one!)
- 2. What is your definition of a miracle? (**Luke 18:27**) Have you ever experienced one? How does your view of Creation impact the types of miracles you expect from God?
- 3. Read **1 John 1:5**. Go around your Small Group and reflect on the six elements of light Miles gave in his sermon. (See the back of your lesson plan). Share personal experiences of how God has done these things in your life.

DAILY WALK

- 1. Read **John 17** aloud in your Group did you know that this is a prayer of Jesus for you? As you read this in your Small Group, make a list of the things in which Jesus was praying for.
- 2. What does it mean to be in one accord? What is Unity? Why is it so important? Do I have to agree with everything you say in order to be unified?
- 3. In the following verses fine the phrase "one accord" and see what the results of that state was on those who were unified. Acts 1:14, 2:1, 2:46, 4:24, 5:12

HOMEWORK

1. Pray that God would do miracles in His Church today. As a Small Group take time this week to PRAY for God to do amazing things beyond what we could even ask or think. (Read **Ephesians 3:20**)
