2. Memory Verse

Exodus 6:6 - "Therefore say to the children of Israel: 'I am the Lord; I will bring you out from under the burdens of the Egyptians, I will rescue you from their bondage, and I will redeem you with an outstretched arm and great judgments.'"

3. Discussion Questions

- 1) The purpose of studying anything is that you are then going to do something with what you have studied.
 - a) Are you approaching the Word of God this way?
 - b) How much time do you spend studying Gods word? How do you study Gods word? What tools do you use?
 - c) Who are you sharing what you have studied with? Do you have someone you are pouring into?
 - d) What can you do to make this better?
- 2) Deliverance is based on Gods faithful promises (Ex 6:6-8)
 - a) What promises has God made in your life? (Hebrews 13:5, James 5:16, Mt 18:19, Lk 12:28, Lk 17:6, Jn 14:3)
 - b) How are you living your life in response to these promises?
 - c) How can you share these promises with others, non-believers?
- Deliverance provides us with the opportunity to <u>Celebrate or Worship</u> God (Ex 5:1-3)
 - a) What does it mean to worship God? (Ps 95:6, Mt 4:10, Rev 4:10)
 - b) Define deliverance as it applies to your own life.





- c) Understanding deliverance, why would the response be to worship?
- d) If you had not been delivered, what would your life be like today?
- 4) Deliverance must be viewed as something worth <u>fighting</u> for. (**Ex 5**)
 - a) In the sermon, Pastor Miles mentioned that the word for fighting here is synonymous with sacrifice. Discuss this.
 - b) Since you have discussed with deliverance means to you, why would you want to fight for it?
 - c) Who exactly are we fighting? (Eph 6:12)
 - d) Discuss the following statement, "We need to fight for everything that the Bible says we can do/get/experience."
- 5) Deliverance forces us to get in step with Gods plan. (Ex 5:22-23)
 - a) Please discuss the following statement, "God is not there to answer your every beck and call - We are to surrender our lives to Him, and trust Him along the way."
 - b) How do we "get in step' with Gods plan? (2 Chr 7:14)
- 6) Deliverance depends on our <u>reliance</u> on Gods supernatural intervention.

(Ex 6:1, 7:1-7)

- a) Define the word reliance.
- b) Define the words supernatural intervention.
- c) Understanding deliverance, as we have already discussed, how is this dependent on our relying on Gods supernatural intervention?
- d) Discuss the following statement, "Gods plan for us is always better than our plan." Do you believe this? How would you explain this to a non-believer?
- 7) Who have you invited to your group? Why is it important to keep inviting people to the group?
