Want to know what to say when your friends challenge the Bible's authority? The following will give you answers to some of the most common challenges to the validity of the Bible. In the left column you will find a commonly offered challenge. In the right column, you will find a sound, tried and true response. Study up!

	Response:
Challenge:	
The Bible is too old to be reliable.	For a work of antiquity, like the Bible, to be counted as reliable, there are two criteria:
	• Existing copies have to be written within 1000 years of original writing.
	And there have to be at least 10 copies produced within this time.
	In the case of the New Testament:
	• 25,000 copies and counting! All copies have been made within 1000 years of the original.
	• Earliest copy is a scrap of the Gospel of John, within 15 years of the writing! Experts say that it is probably a 2nd hand copy—copied from the original.
	• NT can also be entirely reproduced based on church fathers quoting it (like in a Max Lucado book, for example).

	• To this day it now stands bare as a rock, and is only inhabited by small fisherman villages. It should be noted that they use the bareness of the island to spread their nets to dry.
	Example 2: Prophecies of Jesus
	• Place of birth, time of birth, manner of birth, betrayal, manner of death, people's reactions, casting lots, piercing, burial.
	• These are only a handful of the prophecies about Jesus, but there is no way that he could have purposefully orchestrated even these few!

Challenge:	Response:
We can't verify that the Bible isn't just man's opinions.	 There are over 40 authors of the Bible including a political leader, a fisherman, a herdsman, a military general, a servant, a prime minister, a king, a doctor, a tax collector, and a rabbi. It is unlikely that opinions from authors with such huge differences in culture and background would all happen to write hundreds of pages of material without any major contradiction. Prophecy proves that the Bible is far more than man's opinion. Opinions cannot bring forth a prophecy over and over again and have them fulfilled precisely.
There are too many contradictions in the Bible.	• Often what appears to be a contradiction is simply a matter of the details that were recorded by one author vs. the details recorded by a different author. One account might have more details than another, but that does not make it a contradiction.
The Bible was written way after Jesus walked on earth. It is probably more legend than truth.	 Paul started writing first, and that was in the 50s. All the other books of the New Testament were written between the 50s up to about 90AD. This is hardly enough time for any legend to have formed. Paul wrote I Corinthians between 55-57AD. In chapter 15 he references a creed about Jesus dying, rising from the dead, and appearing to 500 witnesses. He also says that he had already given them this creed. His first visit was in 51AD. However, the creed itself has a structure and literary style that resembles Hebrew origin, so we can only assume that Paul would have received this creed while in Damascus or Jerusalem. This then places Paul's reception of the creed between 32 and 38AD. This is only a handful of years after the crucifixion, and way too early for a legend to start.
The authors of the Bible were uneducated fisherman.	 The authors included folks besides just fishermen; there was a political leader, a herdsman, a military general, a servant, a prime minister, a king, a doctor, a tax collector, and a rabbi. If it was all an elaborate hoax the conspirators would have selected authors with higher titles than these. The fact that the list includes fishermen, a tax collector, a herdsman, etc. only proves the fact that there was no conspiracy.
We don't know if we should take the Bible literally so how can we believe it?	 There are many different genres, or literary styles, found in the Bible; each literary style needs to be read appropriately. Some of these styles are as follows: poetry, songs, narrative, private dialogue, public dialogue, teaching, law, parables, prophecy, etc. Each style has its own rules for study, and taking it any other way is to abuse the text.

APPLICATION

How to Study the Bible - What does it mean to me?

Step ONE – Know it!

Charles Spurgeon was asked how a Christian could obtain a thorough knowledge of the Bible. He replied, "there are three rules to follow in order to have a deep understanding of the Word of God:

- I. FIRST, read the BIBLE.
- 2. SECOND, read the BIBLE.
- 3. And THIRD, read the BIBLE.

The Bible does not need to be rewritten, just reread. If you don't understand it, that's your fault! Study it and get someone in your life who will hold you accountable.

Step TWO – Trust it!

The Bible is our weapon of defense as well as offense.

- It is flawless.
- 2. It is our solid foundation.
- 3. It is completely reliable.
- 4. It should be used in battle (Ephesians 6) Here we see it as the only offensive weapon when it comes to the armor of God. And never forget the example Jesus gave us when he was tempted by the devil after his forty day fast ... remember his words "It is written!" He quotes Scripture!

Step THREE – Use it!

Obedience to the Word demonstrates our love to God

Look up the following - Matthew 22:34, John 14:15, John 14:21

Jesus said that if we are going to show our love to God, we are going to do it by having and keeping the commandments.

Do you have them? ... Do you know them? ... Do you keep the commandments? Don't say you love God if you don't keep His commandments!

Finally, remember that the Word of God is essential in witnessing.

Romans 10:17 "So then faith comes by hearing, and hearing the Word of God."

It's the Holy Spirit speaking through the Word that's going to make a difference, not us.

DID YOU KNOW?

Our Predicament

Over the past 30 years, our population has increased 41%, but our Gross Domestic Product has tripled, and our social spending has had the benefit of a 500% increase. Impressive by any standard.

And yet, we have had a 500% increase in violent crime, a 400% increase in illegitimate births, a 400% increase in the divorce rate, a 300% increase in single parent homes, a 200% increase in teenage suicides, and a 75% decrease in SAT scores.

Each day in America there are 2,795 teen pregnancies and 4,219 teenagers who contract a sexually transmitted disease. Every 64 seconds a baby is born to a teenage mother; five minutes later, a baby will have been born to a teenager who *already* has a child. Ten hours later, 560 babies will have been born to teenagers.

Over the past 30 years, we have conducted over 31 million abortions; every day there are 1,106 teen abortions alone! (When John the Baptist began his ministry, he was only 9 inches long and weighed about a pound and a half. In the womb, he was Spirit-filled, and leapt for joy).

We are a nation in peril. We lead the industrialized world in murder, rape, and violent crime. In elementary and secondary education, we are near the bottom in achievement scores. There is a coarseness, callousness, cynicism, banality, and vulgarity signaling the decivilization of our nation.

An analysis of these, and virtually every social and cultural indicator, clearly shows a marked deterioration since the early 1960s. What event transpired then to cause this rapid and catastrophic destruction of our American culture? **We outlawed God from our schools!**
