Grow:

 - a. How does the Bible describe the nature of man? (Psalm 51:5, Jeremiah 17:9)

- 4. Scientology teaches that engrams, traumatic memories from past lives, control your spiritual potential and not the Holy Spirit.
 - a. How does the above differ from what the Bible teaches about spiritual potential? (Philippians 1:6, 2 Peter 1:3)
 - b. Has there been a time when you knew God was working through you to help others? (1 Corinthians 12:4-11)
- 5. Scientology teaches that "Clear", the condition of being cleared of engrams or past traumatic memories comes from a costly mental process of auditing resulting in spiritual liberation. It denies turning to God through repentance.
 - a. Where does spiritual freedom come from? (Colossians 2:13-14, Romans 10:9)
 - b. Has there ever been a time when you have ignored sin in your life? How did you feel when you finally confessed it to God? (Psalm 32:1-5, 1 John 1:9)
