SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS - ROAD TRIP

So, where do I fit in this journey?

Traveling in a group is always an interesting experience. Usually it means that you have to pack extra patience and take on different responsibilities. Traveling on this Road Trip to the promise land is no different, so pack your patience and get ready for different responsibilities!

Maybe you take trips with groups all the time. Maybe you prefer to travel alone or with a selected, hand picked, close, special people. Regardless of your preferences, the road trip God has planned for us is a group experience and you have an important job to do on the trip. This week, the small group questions are designed to get you thinking about what it means to travel as a group and how you can decipher your role on this journey.

Getting Started

- 1. There no doubt is a difference in traveling alone and traveling in a group. How does the *experience* of traveling change when you travel with a group rather than take a trip by yourself?
- 2. God is taking us on a road trip to the promise land—to a place of abundant blessing. Because our relationship with God is personal by nature it is easy to forget that the road trip we're on is actually a group experience. In what ways does traveling in a group change your *perspective* on the road trip? How does it impact your *place and purpose* on the trip?
- 3. What do we gain from taking this road trip in a group? What are the *benefits* from traveling as a team?



Digging Deeper

- 4. It may take some time to adjust our perception of the road trip we are taking from simply "us and God," to being a part of a group of people who are being led by God. What does the Bible say about our "group travel" and how we should think about it?
 - a. Ephesians 4:16
 - b. I Corinthians 12:7
 - c. Romans 12:4-6a
- 5. What are some of the roles we assume as a part of our group travel? What do these roles look like specifically at the Rock? (You can refer to http://www.therocksandiego.org/ministries/ for a list of ministries.)
 - a. Romans 12:6-8

- b. Ephesians 4:11-13
- 6. The Bible makes it clear that God expects us to determine our role on the road trip; and we will be held accountable for what we do or do not do. Consider these passages:
 - a. Matthew 25:14-30

- b. Romans 14:10-12
- c. What are some of the ramifications of not fulfilling the role God has ordained for us? How does it impact the Kingdom of God? How does it impact the body of Christ?
- 7. We are discovering our role, learning how to function in our role, and in the process of maturing in Christ all at the same time. We are bound to make mistakes. Being on a road trip with a group of people who are all learning together can be frustrating. What does the Bible tell us about how we should treat one another through this process?
