SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS – ARE YOU KIDDING ME?

In the book of Revelation (4:8), we are shown an amazing picture of heaven where these angelic creatures continually praise God by calling him "Holy." The word 'holy' means 'set-apart/different,' and if there has ever been a better word to describe God than different, I'm not sure what it is. God is the only being with the ability to create something out of nothing; where as, we create from the materials He made. He is the only being who completely knows everything there is to know. He is the only sinless being. His methods, plans, and thoughts are so different than what we do naturally. In the brief time of His humiliation, when Jesus came to earth, He came both as God and man. Imagine, Jesus came as a baby and the limitless God at the same time. If you're having trouble getting your mind around that concept, don't worry, no one has fully grasped it since the beginning of time.

In the story of the battle of Jericho, we see what has to be the most moronic battle plan in the history of war. To defeat the enemy, the people were told to march around the city and to scream and blow their trumpets to knock down the walls of the city. The last time I checked, if I scream at the wall, it doesn't fall down. Yet, this was the plan God gave Joshua. Read Joshua 6:27.

Getting Started

- 1. When was the last time you were faced with a situation where doing things "God's way" seemed like a bad idea? Tell the group about that situation.
- 2. Having faith in God is difficult. In your opinion, what are some of the reasons for this?

Digging Deeper

When reading the Bible, it is easy to forget that characters are real people, that they lived daily lives just like us. When we read about the battle for Jericho it takes only 21 verses, but for Joshua it was months and years in the making. We see the outcome so shortly after the problem, but for Joshua, as he was carrying out God's commands, the outcome hadn't occurred yet. As we dig deep into this text, try to imagine you are Joshua...

- 3. ...You are in control of millions of people, a sizeable army, and you are moving out of the wilderness to take one of the most fortified cities in the world, what sort of battle plans are you hoping the Lord gives you?
- 4. ...Instead of giving you some genius plans of war, God calls you to mobilize millions of people and have them march silently around the city. Further, God told you this in private, where other people couldn't hear. What are you feeling at that moment?
- 5. ...As the people begin to march around the city and continue for seven days, what are some of your fears? What will happen to Joshua if God lets him down?
- 6. Are these fears similar to your own? What has God asked you to do that seems impossible? How does Joshua's life encourage you to believe God despite your fears?

Bringing it Home

- 7. In your opinion, why does God require faith in the people who are close to him? What does Hebrews 11:6 say?
- 8. It's easy to talk about faith, but how does one increase their faith in God?
- 9. At the beginning of chapter 7 is the story of Achan who outwardly had faith in God's provision, but inwardly trusted in himself more than God. What role do secret actions, motivations, and attitudes play in having faith in God?
