SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS – IMAGE IS EVERYTHING

Please note: There are more questions than normal this week. Feel free to respond to the ones that relate more to your group; do not feel any pressure to get through every question.

When I was in high school, I applied to a summer program at MIT. Consequently, my chemistry teacher wrote a letter of recommendation. I never thought someone could think such nice things about me. Have you ever considered why other people may have a greater opinion of you than you do of yourself? When we consider that God has given us the awesome responsibility to care for creation, we must stop and ask ourselves, "Does God know something about us that we do not know?" In fact, responsibility should serve as a self-esteem steroid. The very act of placing responsibility upon a person implies and communicates trust. God must have a very high opinion of our abilities because He has given His children an incredible level of responsibility. Today, we will dig into the message of creation, our relationship to it, and what it says about our God I.M.A.G.E.

Getting Started

When we affirm, compliment and encourage we touch people's hearts and positively affect their self image. How wonderful it feels when someone, for no apparent reason, calls just to thank us for being part of the group or leaves a little note to remind us how much we matter.

- 1. Describe a time when you got an unexpected compliment or received a kind note; how did that make you feel?
- 2. What kind of gesture tends to touch your heart the most? Spend some time going around the group encouraging one another.

Digging Deeper

Ephesians 2:10 describes God's children in the Bible's original language as His "masterpiece." Unfortunately, our enemy works continuously to get us to believe the exact opposite.

- 1. Read Genesis 1:1, 26, 27; John 1:1; Hebrews 1:1-2.

b. Why do you think that God made such a wondrous creation? If God made creation to glorify Himself, can you list some ways you can accentuate creation's purpose?

- c. Can you give some examples of evidence for intelligent design of the universe?
- 4. Read James 1:17; Job 38:1-11.
 - a. G—As reliable creative creatures we are to give credit to God for His creativity.
 - b. When was the last time that you were totally overwhelmed by God's creativity in creation? Can you describe what you felt?
 - c. The Bible suggests that God created all things "out of nothing." If this is true, what does this say about His power? What does creation tell us about His goodness?
- 5. Read Jeremiah 1:5; Psalm 139:13; Isaiah 43:7; Revelation 4:11
 - a. E--We were created to worship for all eternity.
 - b. What does it mean to truly worship God? Is it limited to singing on Sundays or did God have something much more in mind?
 - c. The Bible tells us that people are eternal, but the rest of creation is passing away. What does this suggest about what humanity's place in the created order?
