SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS – IMAGE MAGNIFICATION

An electron microscope is a type of microscope that uses electrons to illuminate and create an image of a specimen. It has much higher magnification and power than a regular light microscope, with magnifications up to about two million times compared to about two thousand, allowing it to see smaller objects and greater detail in these objects. Unlike a light microscope which uses glass lenses to focus light, the electron microscope uses electrostatic and electromagnetic lenses to control the illumination and imaging of the specimen.

For the believer, the body of Christ (the church) acts likes an electron microscope magnifying the true image that God has embedded deep within us. Unfortunately, many Christians try going it alone without the help of other believers only to find that their true image is never really fully realized.

Getting Started

Then answer the following question: How have you expressed those traits in your relationship with God as a member of His church?

 - a. Your individual personality is crystallized in the church.
 - b. Looking at the 1 Corinthians passage, what part of the body do you most identify with and why?
 - c. What service to the body do you enjoy providing most?
 - d. If you knew that you couldn't fail, what great thing would you attempt for God?
 - e. If you don't know your spiritual gifts, you can take the spiritual gifts test found at http://www.therocksandiego.org/giftstest/.

- 3. Moral Mirror: Read 2 Timothy 2:15
 - a. Our moral mirror is polished by service to God within His body.
 - b. How would engaging in service to Jesus' body help you with your struggle against sin?
- 4. Authority to Rule: Read 2 Timothy 2:4
 - a. Your authority to rule is exercised in the church.
 - b. Do you think you are fulfilling your ministry capacity at this point in time?
 - c. What would have to change in your life to fulfill your current potential?
- 5. God's Friend: Read 2 Corinthians 5:12-21
 - a. God calls us not only to be His friends but to be His ambassadors.
 - b. What group of people has God given you the most authority to speak into their lives on His behalf?
 - c. How can you leverage your influence in a greater way for God's Kingdom?
- 6. Eternal Spirit: Read Mark 16:15
 - a. We are assigned to convey an eternal message.
 - b. Who are you currently building a relationship for the expressed purpose of sharing the gospel?
 - c. Who are you praying for to respond to the gospel?
 - d. When was the last time you shared the gospel with someone? What happened?
