SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS -

I love to watch movies and one of my all time favorites is "The Matrix". At one point Neo (Keanu Reeves) is confronted by Morpheus (Laurence Fishburne). They are both sitting in a darkened room facing each other. Morpheus shows Neo two pills; the notorious blue pill and red pill. If Neo takes the first pill his eyes will be opened and begin to see the world as it really is, but he won't be able to go back to his old life. Or he can take the 2nd pill which will return him to the life he knew and never learn the truth.

I remember when I was faced with the truth and I had to decide if I was going to surrender my life, or if I was going reject the truth. When I chose the truth I felt like a huge weight was removed from my shoulders, my eyes were open and I was finally living life to its fullest. Everything started to make sense and the fog of depression was removed. I thought that it would last forever... but it didn't. Slowly the distractions began reintroducing themselves.

Peter quickly proclaimed Jesus as the Messiah... yet only six verses later he is rebuked by Christ. I love the fact that even Peter didn't always get it right, but he tried. He was the only disciple that actually walked on the water. Remember how Christ called him out, and as his eyes were on Christ, he was doing it. He was walking on water! But when he was distracted by the wind and took his eyes off of Christ he began to sink (Matthew 14:22-36).

Getting Started

What distracts you from truly pursuing Christ?

How can you begin to eliminate that distraction from your life?

Digging Deeper:

Read Matthew 16:13-20

- 1. Read Matthew 16:13. Caesarea Phillipi was littered in idol worship. Where have you been that could be called a modern day Caesarea Phillipi? What was it like?
- 2. Read Matthew 16:14-15. What were your thoughts of Christ before surrendering to Him? Who is Christ to you now? How did you surrender to Him?
- 3. Read Matthew 17-18. God had a plan for Peter, building the church. Where do you think God is asking you to step out of the boat and follow Him? What step can you take this week to begin?
- 4. Read Hebrews 12:1. What hinders you in your walk with Christ? Where do you feel "entangled"?
- 5. Read Hebrews 12:2. What does it meant to "fix our eyes on Jesus"? How can you practice that?

Bringing it Home

We often limit the power of God in our lives. We minimize who we are. The bible says that we are adopted sons and co-heirs with Christ! That means that we have a piece of the inheritance! We matter to God and He sees all the great things we can do.

I have an ongoing image of a beautiful red corvette. I can hear the grumbling as it sits in idle on my street. I picture myself sliding onto the black leather driver seat. I place my hand on the gear shaft and rev the engine. But instead of throwing it into gear, I keep it in neutral, get out and begin to push it down the street. You see, I have this vehicle that has great potential, but it can only be used if I get in and put it in drive. Often that's how we treat God. God has given us great power by having the Holy Spirit in us. We limit the work He wants to do by thinking that we're not good enough, or by not even stepping out to try. If only we would wake up to whom we are in Him and see ourselves the way that He sees us, we too could find ourselves in the middle of the lake walking on water with Jesus. Finish the lesson by asking these questions:

Who are we in Christ (i.e. son's of God, co-heirs, saints)?

What assurance/comfort does give you to help you take a step of faith?
