SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS - "A.W.C.I.P.A."

This week I am celebrating 5 years of marriage. Over this short period of time, the one thing that I've learned is how important communication is to a healthy relationship. I have learned to monitor our marriage by how deep and vulnerable our conversations are. When I am closed off and not engaging in conversation, I find that the depth of our relating to each other is lessened. Theologian Dallas Willard says this about prayer in his book "Spirit of the Disciplines":

"Prayer is conversing, communicating with God. When we pray we talk to God, aloud or within our thoughts. In the nature of the case, prayer almost always involves other disciplines and spiritual activities if it is to go well, especially study, meditation, and worship, and often solitude and fasting as well."

As a kid I thought that prayer was formal and needed to be read in a book like the hymns we sang, but as I've grown closer to Christ, I realize that this is very static and doesn't invite God into my life. Just like my marriage, my relationship with God can be measured with how well I communicate with Him... prayer. We all know that God knows everything, but until I'm willing to be completely vulnerable and open myself up to Him, our relationship will be hindered. I desire to live a life of complete surrender to God, and that requires complete honesty with Him.

A- Adoration/Admire

- 1. Read Mary's prayer/song in Luke 1:46-55. Of the attributes of God that Mary expressed, which ones do you appreciate the most? Which ones challenge you the most? Why?
- 2. Where did God show up in Mary's life according to the prayer? Where is God showing up in your life? Spend time having each person in the group pray a sentence of adoration to God for who He is in their life right now.

W- Waiting

How often do you listening to God? When was the last time you really heard God's voice? What did he say? How did you respond?

C- Confession

Read Psalm 51. This was written by David after he was confronted by Nathan when he committed adultery with Bathsheba. When was the last time you were this broken and honest to God about your sins? What do you need to confess today? What do we need to confess as a church? As a nation?

I- Intercession

Read Genesis 18:16-33. Whom is God calling you to intercede for as Abraham did? What enemy does God want you to be praying for? What ministry can you as a group spend focused time praying for tonight?

P- Petition

Read Psalm 13. When was the last time you were brutally honest with God about your feelings and thoughts? If God could answer one prayer right now, what would you have Him grant in your personal life?

A- Adoration/Admire	
Close the meeting praising God again.	Take time going around adoring Him.
