## SMALL GROUP QUESTIONS - THE JESUS DILEMMA (OT WITNESS)

#### **Getting Started**

- 1. What is a theophany as defined by Pastor Miles in his sermon?
- 2. Review the 5 points of "OT Witness" as listed in the lesson plan:
  - 1. Jesus is the 'I AM' who independently exists. (cf. Exodus; John 8:58)
  - 2. Jesus receives our **prayers**. (cf. Genesis 32; John 16:23)
  - 3. Jesus <u>judges</u> sin. (cf. Genesis 18; John 5:26-27)
  - 4. Jesus <u>fights</u> our enemies. (cf. Josh. 5:13-15; Rev. 19:11-16)
  - 5. Jesus protects from hell fire. (cf. Dan. 3; Matt. 25:34; John 3:16; John 5:24)

#### **Digging Deeper**

This week's message is a continuation from last week's...

1. Read Col. 1:15-20 together as a group. Try to define the attributes of Jesus as listed in these verses.

Consider the term **sovereignty**: A theological term that refers to the unlimited power of God, who has sovereign control over the affairs of nature and history. The Bible declares that God is working out His sovereign plan of redemption for the world and that the conclusion is certain.

- **2.** Col. 1:15 states, "He is the image of the invisible God, the firstborn of all creation. For by him all things were created..." Consider the following notes below:
  - **Image** = *eikon*, likeness, or form; Christ is the image of the invisible God. Since representation of what is invisible is impossible, the meaning here is a revelation with substantial participation.
  - **Firstborn** = *prototokos*, or existing before, superior; what is stated is Christ's supremacy over creation as its mediator. The term *prototokos* is used, then because of its importance as a word for rank.
  - **OT Reference** = the rabbis said it meant preeminence (cf. Ex. 4:22). It was also used for the eldest son as heir and manager of the family. All used as a way to identify the Messiah (cf. Psalm 89:27).

Based on this verse and the notes above, how does this change or solidify your view of Christ as Lord and God?

**3.** The Latin term *imageo dei*, or image of God, refers to man, being made by God in the image of God. We typically define the attributes of God and his image in two categories: communicable (or shared) and incommunicable (or unshared) attributes.

Communicable (Shared) Attributes Incommunicable (Unshared) Attributes

Holiness Omnipresence
Love Omniscience
Truth Omnipotence
Righteousness Immutability
Mercy Eternality
Beauty Sovereignty

How are you worshipping God and honoring him through your shared attributes, and how are you worshipping him by recognizing your unshared attributes?
