Reviewing the Message:

A Do Something Disciple - A person with a disciplined pursuit of the heart of the Father, a heart being perfected in love for God, people, and self.

H – Holiness **E** – Evangelism **A** – Appreciation **R** – Relationships **T** – Thoughts

Sermon Application: **ASK** God for His heart:

- Assess the condition of your heart. Our heart changes moment-to-moment.
- Search Scripture for the conviction of God's heart. *God's conviction is consistent*.
- **K**nit your heart with God. *A deliberate and constant surrender*.

Weekly Memory Verse: Exodus 33:11a (NKJV): "So the LORD spoke to Moses face to face, as a man speaks to his friend. And he would return to the camp, but his servant Joshua the son of Nun, a voung man, did not depart from the tabernacle."

On Sunday Pastor Miles continued his sermon on how to **ASK** God for His Heart. To ASK God for His Heart we need to first <u>assess</u> the condition of our hearts. Next, we need to <u>search</u> the scripture for the conviction of God's heart. Then, we need to <u>knit</u> our heart with God.

Read Exodus 33:8-11. Preceding this passage, the Israelites had fallen into deep sin by erecting and worshipping a false idol. Because of the Israelites' sin, God does not want to be in the midst of the people as He is holy and there is only One true God to worship. In Exodus 33:8-11 we see that although the Israelites have sinned against God, Moses and God continue to have a close face-to-face relationship. The first part of verse 33:11 reads, "So the LORD spoke with Moses face to face, as a man speaks to his friend..." Here we see the reality of intimacy and accessibility between God and Moses. In the ancient Near East, it was dishonorable to look a superior in the face. Yet, here we see Moses and God speaking as friends. It's amazing that our God would meet with man face-to-face, as a friend. It is remarkable that Jesus also calls us His friends, "No longer do I call you servants, for a servant does not know what his master is doing; but I have called you friends, for all things that I heard from My Father I have made known to you" (John 15:15 NKJV).

<u>Question:</u> Can you describe your face-to-face time with God (where, when, and how)? Discuss this question in your rGroup. Next, connect with someone in your rGroup to help hold you accountable to your "face-to-face" time with God this week.

How is Your Heart?

Pastor Miles shared a story about his grandson and how his grandson was afraid of the dark. Pastor Miles shared that his grandson was only comfortable walking in the darkness if he knew that Pastor Miles was with him. In our lives we all face challenges that require the faith that God is with you. In your rGroup discuss the following:

- What are some current challenges or struggles that you are facing where you need God's presence?
- How has God been speaking to you about those challenges and/or struggles?
- This week how will you walk in in a greater confidence that God is forever present?

How are you pursuing God's HEART?

On a daily basis, ASK God for his heart:

- Assess the condition of your heart.
- Search Scripture for the conviction of God's heart.
- Knit your heart with God.
