Reviewing the Message:

A Do Something Disciple - A person with a disciplined pursuit of the heart of the Father, a heart being perfected in love for God and people.

<u>D12</u>: Avoids that which is displeasing to God.

 \mathbf{H} – Holiness \mathbf{E} – Evangelism \mathbf{A} – Appreciation \mathbf{R} – Relationships \mathbf{T} – Thoughts

<u>Sermon Application</u>:

- Father, give me a heart that identifies itself as **PRIEST**, set apart to worship You.
- Jesus, create in me a heart that avoids biblical **SUBSTITUTES** in my life.
- Holy Spirit, develop a heart in me that avoids anything that leads others AWAY from You.

Sermon Application Prayer: **ASK** God for His heart:

- Assess the condition of your heart. Our heart changes moment-to-moment.
- Search Scripture for the conviction of God's heart. *God's conviction is consistent*.
- Knit your heart with God. A deliberate and constant surrender.

Weekly Memory Verse: Leviticus 10:3 (NKJV) "This is what the LORD spoke, saying: 'By those who come near Me I must be regarded as holy; and before all the people I must be glorified.'"

Monthly Memory Verse: Genesis 1:26-27 "Then God said, 'Let Us make man in Our image, according to Our likeness; let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, over all the earth and over every creeping thing that creeps on the earth." 27 So God created man in His own image; in the image of God He created him; male and female He created them."

On Sunday, from the book of Leviticus, Pastor Miles explained how God taught the people, the priests, and to all of Israel the correct way to worship Him in holiness. The rituals, ceremonies, laws, and principles <u>all</u> applied to them (Israel) in the "then and there". The principles still apply to Christians in the "here and now" for us.

<u>Read Leviticus 1-13</u>: In Leviticus God puts into writing how to correctly live, how to live safely and how to prosper in God's presence. It was written to draw the Israelites to the understanding of the infinite holiness of God, and that He desires them to act in a holy manner toward Himself. After they had broken

their covenant with God, while Moses was on Mt. Sinai, God makes clear who He is. God is to be worshipped in the very way that they were to live out their lives—in holiness. God's people were to be set apart, different in almost every way. This included being different from the world around them socially, politically, economically, morally and spiritually. For the Israelites these principles were to be unchanging. Blessings and curses come with obedience or disobedience to these principles. And just as for Israel, God desires believers today to BE HOLY BECAUSE HE IS HOLY.

Pastor Miles discussed the things that we do that displease God. As a rGroup, make a list of common behaviors that break God's heart and then discuss these together. It could be said that the opposite of what displeases God is what we should seek after to be holy.

<u>Question:</u> Identify and describe one behavior that breaks God's heart and your plan to eliminate it. Ask your accountability partner to hold you accountable.
