Sermon Application Questions from Sunday's Message:

On Sunday, Pastor Miles encouraged us as a church to listen to God's voice. People generally accept the fact that the devil speaks negatively to people and to discourage people. Yet, so much greater to God's voice to speak life, love and encouragement to His people should we make a commitment to be attentive to Him. God's sheep hear His voice (John 10:27-28). Pastor Miles taught about how important it is to *know* God's voice and to *listen* to God's voice for our direction for our lives. In his message he focused on the voice of a prophet. A prophet is someone who declares 'a Word' that becomes a 'thing' that brings 'heaven to earth.' Rather than letting the issues of the culture dictate to our beliefs and choices, as God's people we need to be committed to speaking on behalf of God's Kingdom and to be an influence to our family, workplace, and community.

- 1. Prophetic people are from all walks of life. Jeremiah 1:1
- 2. Prophetic people are a fulfillment of a prophetic utterance. Jeremiah 1:5
- 3. Prophetic people are aware of the times. Jeremiah 1:3
- 4. Prophetic people communicate what they hear. Jeremiah 1:6-8
- 5. Prophetic people represent God to people, cities, and nations. Jeremiah 1:5
- 6. Prophetic people walk in the favor of God. Jeremiah 22:1-3
- 7. Prophetic people live a sacrificially obedient lifestyle. Jeremiah 16:1-2
