Leaving a Legacy

Monthly Discipleship Focus for June:
Faithfully avoids that which distracts me from obeying You.

On Sunday, Pastor Mike continued the series on leaving a legacy of knowing Jesus. Read Hebrews 11:1-16, then explore the following:

1. In God's Kingdom, legacies are **ETERNAL**. Hebrews 11:5-7
God is eternal, so when we do something for Him, it lasts forever, it isn't temporary. A legacy is something you leave behind, whether it's directly to our children or to generations beyond. Invest your time, effort, and finances in something that will last. What do you have to "offer" -- what is one thing that you are sacrificing in your life that honors and pleases God?
2. The legacies we leave for God require **FAITH** and **ACTION**. Hebrews 11:8-12
Sometimes God calls us to things that people don't understand. Whether that's seeking a new job, moving to a new area, ending a relationship, leaving a specific church, going back to school, we are called to walk by faith to obey God. What is one thing God is telling you to do, that may not even make sense at this very moment?
3. It's only a legacy for God if He gets the **GLORY**. Hebrews 11:13-16
When God is building something within you or around you, step out on faith and let Him work. Things may not seem clear at the moment, but whatever God has put on your heart, He will fund it, provide for it, fund it, direct people to you, and more. Believe God for what's next. What are some words of encouragement that you can pass on to your loved ones, to the next generation?
