

## Forgiving Freedom Matthew 18:21-35

February 9, 2003

<b>The question</b> : Is there a limit to the frequency of our forgiveness toward others?
<b>The definition:</b> Forgiveness – The willingness to release someone from the <u>responsibility</u> of paying the debt of healing our pain.
<b>New question:</b> How often should I release someone from the responsibility of healing my pain?
<b>Think about this:</b> How often do you want God to free you from the obligation of Jesus' pain on the cross?
THE DOOM OF SIN'S DEBT
<ol> <li>Sin is against a <u>superior</u>. v.23</li> <li>There is an account of sin. v.24</li> </ol>
Ps 40:12 For innumerable evils have surrounded me; My iniquities have overtaken me, so that I am not able to look up; They are more than the hairs of my head; Therefore my heart fails me.
<ul> <li>3. Repayment is mandatory. v.25</li> <li>4. Once you are sold into sin you will be owned by the penalty. v.25</li> </ul>
Gal 6:7 Do not be deceived, God is not mocked; for whatever a man sows, that he will also reap.
5. We are <u>unable</u> to pay.
Ps 49:6-8 Those who trust in their wealth and boast in the multitude of their riches, none of them can by any means redeem his brother, nor give to God a ransom for him-for the redemption of their souls is costly.

6. The master's forgiveness is based solely on his mercy. v.27

**Unforgiveness:** Unwillingness to release someone from the responsibility of healing your pain. • We often refuse to forgive sins smaller than the ones for which we want forgiveness. v.28 We cannot know the degree of our own sin. Jeremiah 17:9 We are more critical of the sins in others than our own. v. 32-33 • We often forget the mercy expressed to us when we are begged for mercy. v.30 Unforgiveness is realized in: Jealousy Anger Resentment **Backbiting** Desire for revenge A critical spirit The freedom we experience when we are forgiven is to be used to forgive others. • God does not reverse\_\_\_\_\_ His pardons but He denies pardons to those that are unqualified for them. v. 33-35 Lord's Prayer: Matt 6:12 And forgive us our debts, as we forgive our debtors. We want limits to be placed on our requirements for mercy toward others, but not on God's requirement for mercy toward us. James 2:13 For judgment is without mercy to the one who has shown no mercy. DO YOU NEED TO REPENT FOR BEING UNFORGIVING? THREE COMPONENTS TO TRUE REPENTANCE: 1. Acknowledgement of wrong: Admit that you are wrong. 2. Admission of guilt: Tell the person of the sin of your heart ands ask them to forgive you. 3. Remember: Repentance has no defense\_\_ Today you can experience the freedom of God's forgiveness by

repenting of your sin.

Receive God's complete forgiveness through faith in Jesus Christ.
