Moses the Man

- 1. Genesis is the book of <u>beginnings</u>. Exodus is the book of <u>exit</u> from <u>Egypt</u>.
- 2. The Jews were in Egypt because <u>Joseph's brothers</u> sold him into slavery. (Gen 37)
- 3. Like Jesus, Moses was born with a <u>death</u> sentence. Like Noah, he was delivered in an ark. (Ex 1-2)
- 4. Moses was found and raised by Pharaoh's <u>daughter</u> and was educated in the wisdom of the Egyptians. (Ex 2, Acts 7:22)
- 5. Moses lived <u>40</u> years in Egypt. After he <u>killed</u> an Egyptian, he then fled to the wilderness to live for <u>40</u> years. (Acts 7:23-32, Ex 7:7, Deut 29: 2-5, 34:5-8)
- 6. The Bible says that Moses was the most <u>humble</u> man in the world, lived 120 years, died on Mt. Nebo, and was not found in a grave. (Ex 12:3, Deut 34:5-8, Jude 9)

The Exodus

- 7. Moses' first encounter with God was at the <u>burning bush</u> at Mt. <u>Sinai.</u> (Ex 3)
- 8. The name that God used to identify Himself to Moses was "IAM THAT IAM" and the four consonants that make up His name are YHWH. (Ex 3)
- God told Moses to remove his shoes because he stood on <u>holy ground</u>, but Moses gave God five <u>excuses</u> for not confronting Pharaoh. (Ex 3)
- 10. Moses' first excuse was, "Who am I?" God's answer encourages us not to focus on *who* we are in the world, but whose we are in heaven. (Ex 3)
- 11. When Moses stood before the powerful Pharaoh and demanded the release of the Jews, the only weapon he had in his hand was a <u>rod</u>. (Ex 4)
- 12. The tenth plague, like the death of Jesus, delivered people from bondage through the death of a <u>firstborn</u>. (Ex 11-12, Col 1:15)
- 13. God sent plagues on Egypt to judge the gods of the Egyptians. (Ex 7-12)
- 14. The singular name for God is <u>El</u>, and the plural form is <u>Elohim</u>.
- 15. God delivered his people from slavery so that they could worship Him. (Ex 7-12)
- 33. During the Passover, the Angel of Death avoided the homes of the Israelites because they had placed the <u>blood</u> of a <u>lamb</u> on the door, just as we are delivered from death by the blood of the Lamb of God, Jesus. (Ex 12, Rev 12:10-11)
- 34. The bread that God sent out of the sky after the Ex was called <u>manna</u>, and like Jesus, it represented the bread of life. (Ex 16, John 6:48)

Journey to the Mountain of God

- 16. Soon after they left Egypt, the people began to <u>complain/murmur</u> because there was no food or water. (Ex 15-17)
- 17. Of all the complainers who exited Egypt, <u>none</u> made it into the Promised Land. (Num 14:2-24, Deut 2:14-16)
- 18. Instead of complaining about what we do not have, we should be <u>thankful</u> for what we do have and think of <u>solutions</u> to the problems we see.

Ministry at Mt. Sinai

- 19. At Mt. Sinai, Moses received instructions that only the <u>sons</u> of his brother <u>Aaron</u> could be priests. (Ex 28)
- 20. God spoke to Moses face to face as a man speaks with his friend. (Ex 33:11)
- 21. The Ten Commandments were given <u>two</u> times because of the <u>golden</u> calf incident. (Ex 32)
- 22. The Ten Commandments were given while Moses fasted for <u>40 days</u> on <u>Mt. Sinai</u>. (Ex 34:28)
- 23. The 10 commandments were written by the <u>finger</u> of God on both sides of <u>stone</u> tablets. The stone indicated that they were <u>permanent</u> and the use of both sides indicated that they were <u>complete</u>. (Ex 31:18)

The Tabernacle

- 24. The Tabernacle was divided into three sections: the <u>court</u>, the <u>Holy place</u> and the <u>Holy</u> of Holies. (Ex 26:33, 27:9-19)
- 25. The name of the innermost part of the tabernacle was the <u>Holy of Holies</u>. (Ex 26:33))
- 26. The Ark is covered by the mercy seat. (Ex 37:1-9)
- 27. The Ark is made of <u>wood</u> covered with <u>gold</u>, symbolizing <u>humanity</u> covered with deity. The mercy set is <u>solid gold</u>, symbolizing all <u>deity</u>. (Ex 37:1-9)
- 28. The two angels on the Mercy Seat were <u>cherubim</u>, which is the plural form of the word <u>cherub</u>. (Ex 37:1-9)
- 29. The high priest went into the Holy of Holies <u>once</u> per year to make an offering for the <u>sins</u> of Israel. This day was called the <u>Day of Atonement</u>. (Ex 30:10)
- 30. Atonement is made up of three words: at-one-ment.
- 31. The high priest made atonement for sins yearly with the blood of animals, but our Great High Priest Jesus did not have to seek <u>forgiveness</u> for His own sins. He offered His own <u>blood</u> as a <u>one time</u> sacrifice for all. (Ex 30:10, Hebrews 7:23-28)
- 32. When the tabernacle was complete, it was filled with God's glory. (Ex 40:34-38)
