Jehovah's Witnesses

- 1. A **cult** is a belief system that follows a <u>distorted</u> version of biblical Christianity, mainly focusing on a distorted view of the identity of Christ and the plan of salvation.
- 2. Cults are usually started by one person who claims access to <u>secret</u> information about God which gives this person <u>power</u> used to <u>control</u> those seeking God. Cults often attempt to control the <u>time</u> and <u>associations</u> of their members.
- 3. **Jehovah's Witnesses** was started by **Charles Taze Russell**, and they teach that only 144,000 J.W. will go to heaven; that Jesus, as the <u>firstborn</u> over all creation, is a <u>created</u> being, is really Michael the <u>Archangel</u>; and that the Holy Spirit is simply a force like electricity.
- 4. J.W. teach that Jesus did not rise from the dead in <u>bodily</u> form. The Bible says His bodily resurrection was confirmed by those who <u>saw</u>, <u>touched</u>, <u>held</u> and ate with Him.
- 5. J.W. teaches that the Holy Spirit is an active force like electricity, not a Person of the Trinity. The Bible says that the Holy Spirit interacts with us by <u>convicting</u> our sin, <u>teaching</u> us truth, <u>praying</u> on our behalf with <u>groanings</u> which cannot be uttered and giving us supernatural gifts.
- 6. In the beginning was the <u>Word</u>, and the Word was with God, and the Word <u>was</u> God. John 1:1
- 7. He is the <u>image</u> of the invisible God, the <u>firstborn</u> over all creation. Colossians 1:15
- 8. Firstborn is a title designating <u>authority</u>, not a <u>birth order</u> position
- 9. For it is by grace you have been saved, through <u>faith</u>, and this not from yourselves; it is the gift of God, not of <u>works</u>, so that no one can <u>boast</u>. Ephesians 2:8-9

Mormonism

- 1. **The book of Mormon** was apparently written by **Joseph Smith** from revelations he received while alone in the mountains.
- 2. Mormons teach that we were born as <u>spirit</u> children in heaven, received a sinful body, and through good works can be exalted to godhood.
- 3. Mormonism teaches that Jesus became a <u>spirit child</u> resulting from the sexual union of Elohim and Mary, and is the <u>spirit brother</u> of Satan, another spirit child of Elohim.
- 4. Mormonism teaches that Elohim, or the God of the Bible, was a spirit child who <u>inherited</u> a sinful body, was exalted to godhood through good works, is presently a <u>man</u> in heaven, and is only God of this <u>planet</u>, not of all creation.

Scientology

- 1. Scientology founder **L. Ron <u>Hubbard</u>** was a <u>science fiction</u> author who taught that man is generally good with <u>divine</u> potential that is limited by memories from <u>past</u> lives.
- 2. Scientology offers psychological training, called <u>auditing</u>, designed to clear bad memories from past lives and release human <u>potential</u> and restoring man to his original divine condition.
- 3. According to Scientology, salvation or reaching your human potential and <u>divine</u> state is not received by faith, but by personal effort or the <u>good works</u> of following the principles of Scientology.
- 4. The Bible says that all have sinned and fall short of the glory of God. Romans 3:23
- 5. For the wages of sin is death, but the gift of God is eternal life in Christ Jesus our Lord. Romans 6:23

Buddhism

- 1. And as it is appointed for men to die once, but after this the judgment. Hebrews 9:27
- 2. **Siddhartha Gautama**, or **Buddha**, believed that we are temporal creations born to lives of <u>sorrow</u> and <u>suffering</u>.
- 3. Buddhism teaches that the quality of your present life is a result of your <u>karma</u>, the sum total of <u>good</u> and <u>bad</u> of <u>past lives</u>, and that until you reach perfect karma or <u>Nirvana</u>, you will continue to be <u>reincarnated</u> over and over again.
- 4. Nirvana is reached through obeying the principles of Buddhism through personal disciplines of self denial.
- 5. Once Nirvana is reached, the reincarnations stop and you cease to exist.

Islam

- 1. Muhammad was born in Mecca, where they worshipped 360 gods.
- 2. He initiated a monotheistic religion, and endorsed worshipping Allah, the moon god.
- 3. Muhammad supposedly received the Quran while alone in a <u>cave</u> from the angel Gabriel.
- 4. Muhammad performed no <u>miracles</u>, and was a <u>sinner</u> who died and <u>remains</u> dead—unlike Jesus.
- 5. Islam offers salvation by works, unless you die fighting the infidel.
- 6. While Christians can be considered <u>children</u> of God, Muslims are considered <u>servants</u> of Allah.

Catholicism

- 1. **The Catholic Church** views the <u>traditions</u> of the church as authoritative as scripture and teaches—contrary to the Bible—that salvation can be attained through <u>good works</u> or the efforts of man, by participating in the <u>Sacraments</u> such as penance, attending Mass, receiving communion, confession etc..
- 2. Their tradition of praying to Mary and saints leads people into <u>idolatry</u> by bowing and praying to idols.
- 3. They teach that the forgiveness of Christ upon confession is not necessarily enough, and may need the assistance of the fire of <u>purgatory</u> to complete the purification process.
- 4. If we confess our sins, he is faithful and just and will forgive us our sins and purify us from all unrighteousness. 1 John 1:9
