#### Memory Verse

Exodus 33:11 So the LORD spoke to Moses face to face, as a man speaks to his friend.

## The Beginning

Genesis is the book of beginnings.

"Bara" means that God created everything from <u>nothing</u>. **Genesis 1:1** Evolution claims that all things resulted from <u>natural</u> or <u>scientific</u> causes. The Bible claims that God created all things. **Genesis 1:1** 

God told Adam and Eve that if they are from the tree of the knowledge of good and evil, they would <u>die</u>.

Satan's #1 weapon was the lie that if Adam and Eve sinned, they would not <u>die</u> but would be like God and in <u>control</u> of their own lives. **Genesis 3:4-5**Satan's first step is to create doubt in the validity of God's <u>Word</u>. **Genesis 3:1**After they sinned, Adam and Eve tried to <u>cover</u> their sin, <u>hide</u> from God and <u>blame</u> someone else. **Genesis 3:7-13** 

Abraham is known as the Father of Faith.

Three major religions that claim Abraham as their father are <u>Christianity</u>, <u>Islam</u>, and <u>Judaism</u>.

"Abraham believed God and it was accounted to him as <u>righteousness</u>" **Genesis 15:6**The three patriarchs of the Old Testament were <u>Abraham</u>, <u>Isaac</u> and <u>Jacob</u>. **Exodus 3:6** 

Abraham had his Son of Promise, <u>Isaac</u>, at the age of 100. Isaac means "<u>laughter</u>." Isaac had twin sons named Esau and Jacob. **Genesis 25:24-26** 

Esau means "hairy" and he was covered with hair.

Jacob bought Esau's birthright for a bowl of <u>red stew.</u> **Genesis25:31-34**Jacob wrestled with Jesus all night and had his name changed to <u>Israel</u> and he had <u>twelve</u> sons. "Angel of the Lord" with a capital 'A' is <u>Jesus</u>.

Jacob's son Joseph was called the dreamer.

Joseph was sold by his brothers into <u>slavery</u> and taken to be a slave in <u>Egypt</u>. **Genesis 37** 

Joseph worked for <u>Potiphar</u>, whose wife had <u>longing</u> eyes for Joseph, kept calling, "<u>Joooooooooe</u>," accused him of <u>rape</u>, and had him sent to <u>prison</u>. **Genesis 37-39** Later, Joseph interpreted Pharaoh's dream about the seven years of <u>plenty</u> and seven years of famine and became ruler of the land.

Before <u>Jacob</u> and <u>Joseph</u> died, they both asked that their <u>bones</u> be brought back to the <u>Promised</u> Land. **Genesis 50** 

## Moses the Man

Genesis is the book of <u>beginnings while</u> Exodus is the book of <u>exit</u> from <u>Egypt</u>. The Jews were in Egypt because <u>Joseph's brothers</u> sold him into slavery. **Genesis 37** Like Jesus, Moses was born with a <u>death</u> sentence. Like Noah, he was delivered in an ark. **Exodus 1-2** 

Moses was found and raised by Pharaoh's <u>daughter</u> and was educated in the wisdom of the Egyptians. **Exodus 2, Acts 7:22** 

Moses lived <u>40</u> years in Egypt. After he <u>killed</u> an Egyptian, he then fled to the wilderness to live for <u>40</u> years. **Acts 7:23-32, Exodus 7:7 and** 

## Deuteronomy 29: 2-5, 34:5-8

The Bible says that Moses was the most <u>humble</u> man in the world, lived 120 years, died on Mt. <u>Nebo</u>, and was not found in a grave. **Exodus 12:3, Deuteronomy 34:5-8 and Jude 9** 

## The Exodus

Moses' first encounter with God was at the <u>burning bush</u> at Mt. <u>Sinai</u>. God identified Himself to Moses as "<u>I AM</u> THAT <u>I AM</u>" and the four consonants that make up His name are YHWH. **Exodus 3** 

God called Moses to confront Pharaoh and deliver the Jews.

Moses' first excuse was, "Who am I?" God's answer encourages us not to focus on *who* we are in the world, but <u>whose</u> we are in heaven. **Exodus 3** 

God delivered his people from slavery so that they could <u>worship</u> Him. **Exodus 7-12** During the Passover, the Angel of Death avoided the homes of the Israelites because they had placed the <u>blood</u> of a <u>lamb</u> on the door, symbolizing how we are delivered from death by the <u>blood</u> of the Lamb of God, Jesus. **Exodus 12, Revelation 12:10-11** 

## Journey to the Mountain of God

Soon after they left Egypt, the people began to <u>complain/murmur</u> because there was no food or water. **Exodus 15-17** 

Of all the complainers who exited Egypt, <u>none</u> made it into the Promised Land.

# **Numbers 14:2-24, Deuteronomy 2:14-16**

Instead of complaining about what we do not have, we should be <u>thankful</u> for what we do have and think of <u>solutions</u> to the problems we see.

## Ministry at Mt. Sinai

At Mt. Sinai, Moses received instructions that only the <u>sons</u> of his brother <u>Aaron</u> could be priests. **Exodus 28** 

God spoke to Moses <u>face</u> to <u>face</u> as a man speaks with his <u>friend</u>. **Exodus 33:11** The Ten Commandments were given <u>two</u> times because of the <u>golden</u> calf incident. **Exodus 32** 

The Ten Commandments were given while Moses fasted for <u>40 days</u> on <u>Mt. Sinai</u>. **Exodus 34:28** 

The 10 commandments were written by the <u>finger</u> of God on both sides of the <u>stone</u> tablets. The stone indicated that they were <u>permanent</u> and the use of both sides indicated that they were <u>complete</u>. **Exodus 31:18**
