Leviticus Review

Genesis –Book of <u>beginnings.</u> Exodus is about the <u>Exit</u> from <u>Egypt.</u> <u>Leviticus</u> – <u>Laws</u> Pertaining to the Levitical <u>Priests</u> - LP, LP Levi **3rd** son of Jacob, Leviticus **3rd** book, Levi had **3** sons. The descendants of Levi were the <u>Levites</u>. The key word(s) – <u>Holy</u> or <u>Holiness.</u> Leviticus is a book in the OT that taught <u>Israel</u> how to be <u>Holy</u>.

Aaron was the bother of <u>Moses</u>. Exodus 28:1 Levites were descendants of <u>Levi</u>. Genesis 46:11, Exodus 6:16 The High Priest was Aaron – head referee. Exodus 28:2 Priests were sons of <u>Aaron</u> – the referees. Exodus 28:1 Levites serve the <u>Priests</u> as caretakers of the sanctuary - grounds keepers. Numbers 3:32 The Priests served the <u>High Priest</u>. Exodus 28:1-2 The Israelites are the players in the game.

Two Major "W" Divisions - 10 Commandment Model

- 1. How to <u>Worship</u> God? Blood sacrifice is required.
- 2. How to <u>Walk</u> with God? Obedience to the Law is required.

Three Holiness Applications

- God is <u>Holy</u>, which means that He is to be respected as our one and only <u>Savior</u>. For the Israelites, He was the God who saved them from slavery in <u>Egypt</u>. Exodus 19:2
- 2. The Israelites were to <u>be</u> Holy as His people. This teaches us that we are to be <u>set apart</u> for the <u>divine</u> purpose of representing God in the world. Exodus 19:2
- **3.** God <u>made</u> the Israelites holy and He <u>alone</u> taught them the <u>boundaries</u> for holiness. This teaches us that He alone can purify us from our sin. **Exodus 20:9**

The Law

The Law was to define the boundaries of relationship with a Holv God. Old Testament Law is clarified in the New Testament by Jesus and other New Testament authors. The Law acts as a tutor by pointing to Jesus' teachings. No one can be justified by the Law, only by faith. Romans 3:20, Galatians 3:24-25 Jesus fulfilled the Law and taught its spiritual application for our lives. Jesus can be seen in the Israelites most holy day- the Day of Atonement. Aaron was the first High Priest - Jesus was the Great High Priest. Hebrews 4:14-16 Atonement means to cover over - Their sins were covered over. Only the High Priest could enter the Holy Place and perform the ceremony – only Jesus can approach God on our behalf. Hebrews 9:11-14 The high priest needed to first be forgiven – Jesus did not need to be forgiven because Jesus was sinless. Hebrews 4:15 Aaron offered the blood of animals yearly - Jesus offered His own blood only once. Hebrews 9:27-28 Aaron, the high priest transferred the sins of the people unto a goat – Jesus took our sins upon Himself. 2 Corinthians 5:21 Two goats were used, one died and one carried sins into the wilderness - Jesus both died and carried away our sins. 2 Corinthians 5:21, Psalm 103:12
