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Ruth was a <u>Moabite</u> woman, who was married or Naomi's son. Ruth was <u>barren</u> ten years until the <u>Lord</u> opened her womb. Ruth took place during the time of the <u>Judges</u>, between the death of <u>Joshua</u> and the first Jewish king, <u>Saul</u>. Judges, when people did what was <u>right</u> in their own eyes. Elimelech – God is <u>king</u>. Naomi – <u>Pleasant</u>, lovely Ruth - <u>compassion</u> for the suffering. Socially - <u>Moabite</u> Emotionally - Her husband died Spiritually - pagan god - <u>Chemosh</u>

Culturally - Moabite in Israel

Moab was across the Jordan river about 50 miles from <u>Bethlehem</u>, where the wilderness <u>wanderings</u> ended, and Moses <u>died</u>.

Naomi's husband died and changed her name to <u>Mara</u>, which means <u>bitter</u>, and moved back to <u>Bethlehem</u>.

Ruth's husband died - she moved back to <u>Bethlehem</u> with Naomi. She said, "your <u>people</u> will be my <u>people</u>, your <u>God</u> will be my <u>God</u>."

Gleaning: the poor gathering food that the farmers dropped.

The land where Ruth gleaned belonged her relative Boaz.

Threshing floor - windy plateau.

Winnowing - The process of separating the wheat from the chaff.

Boaz provided <u>security</u> by telling the young men not to touch her. He also provided <u>friendship</u> by telling her to stay close to his <u>women</u>, and provided <u>food</u> and <u>water</u>.

Ruth fell at Boaz's feet because he <u>served</u> her before she <u>served</u> him, <u>honored</u> her before she <u>honored</u> him because all the people of the town knew her <u>reputation</u> as a <u>virtuous</u> woman.

Laid at his <u>feet</u>, submitting to his <u>love</u>, Naomi's husband died and changed her name to <u>Mara</u> which means <u>bitter</u>.

Ruth's husband died and she pledged her loyalty to Him.

Boaz honored Ruth because she was a <u>virtuous</u> woman, who did not go after <u>young men</u> and <u>honored</u> her mother in law. Boaz pronounced a <u>blessing</u> on Ruth.

Kinsman redeemer

Kinsman – A relative
Redeem – <u>Deliverance</u> from evil by <u>payment</u>
Kinsman Redeemer – A person who buys something on behalf of a relative.
Leviticus 25:25, 47-49
Land transaction - city <u>gate</u> – elders of the city, exchange sandal, transfer of <u>land</u>.

Boaz is like Jesus, our Kinsman Redeemer;

Became a husband to a <u>pagan bride</u>, bought her back from <u>poverty</u>, accepted <u>honor</u> from Ruth, redeemed the <u>land</u> for his bride, blesses his bride with <u>provision</u> and <u>protection</u> from her <u>enemies</u>, secures <u>witnesses</u> to his transaction.

Ruth's son was <u>Obed</u>, who begot <u>Jesse</u> who begot King <u>David</u> and eventually <u>Jesus Christ</u>.

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
