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Genre: The prophets used poetic and narrative language to communicate the message of the prophets.

6 Prophetic Observations
1. Prophets were Law <u>Enforcers</u> who challenged Israel to be Loyal to God's <u>law</u> . Deuteronomy 4:25-31
2. Prophets or Law Enforcers ministry lasted for 300 years, between 760 & 460 BC, beginning with Amos and ending with Malachi.
3. Prophets, or Law Enforcers were always <u>divinely</u> appointed, never self-appointed.
4. Prophet or Law Enforcers were God's <u>mouthpieces</u> who preached and sometimes lived out God's message and never their own.
Their hallmark was, "Thus saith the Lord". Prophets were forth tellers before foreteller.
5. The Law Enforcers pronounced:
Blessings are associated with obedience. Leviticus 26:1-13, Deuteronomy 4:32-40
Curses are associated with disobedience. Leviticus 26:14-39, Deuteronomy 4:15-28
Prophets were sent because Israel was disobedient.
6. False prophets were known for being self-appointed, not enforcing the law, false
predictions and an unwillingness to <u>self-sacrifice</u> .

- 5. Identify what new behavior God is seeking through the Law Enforcer's message.



Reflect, pray and determine what is God communicating to us in the present.

Write, in your own words, a 2-3 sentence prayer or revelation summarizing how the message of the prophet has challenged you to obey God.



Respond and do something!

Do something by praying and deciding what God wants to do in and through you in the future. Identify the steps of faith you need to take in order to facilitate God's promises. What am I going to do to apply my faith to be more of who God wants me to be? Is there sin to repent of? Is there something you can praise God for? Is there someone you need to forgive, serve or speak to? How are you worshiping God in your life?

Further applications – Send a challenge to people in your acquaintance. Be bold in what the Lord is showing you as a step of faith. Use social media to spread the Word of God (e.g. Facebook, Twitter, Bloq, email, etc.).

LAW ENFORCEMENT: PROPHETIC LANGUAGE

{God's Prophets or Law Enforcers were messengers of God sent to Enforce loyalty to God's Law.}

GENRE – Prophetic Language (The prophets used poetic and narrative language, parables and riddles and re-enactments to communicate their message.)

READING RULES – Read the text 2-3 times and identify either:
