3. Why was it written or what issue or conflict caused the letter to be written?				
Answer: Thank the saints and encourage unity. (Philippians 1:3-27)				
4. What does the author say about that issue that caused the letter to be written?				
Answer: Workout your salvation. (Philippians 2:12)				
READ (Philippians 2:12-13) Discovery: Paul encourages the Philippians to train themselves by relying upon and using the benefits of their salvation. REFLECT: The more we train ourselves to live like Christ, the more we will actually become like Him.				
RESPOND: Establish a Spiritualplan.				
A - Increase your Spiritual Flexibility by training yourself to your attention on others instead of yourself. <i>Philippians 2:3</i>				
B - Increase your Spiritual Strength by consistently				
the interests of others above yours. Philippians 2:3				
C - Build up your Spiritual Endurance by increasing the length of time

Write, in your own words, a 2-3 sentence prayer or revelation summarizing how the epistle has challenged you to obey God.



Respond and do something!

Do something by praying and deciding what God wants to do in and through you in the future. Identify the steps of faith you need to take in order to facilitate God's promises. What am I going to do to apply my faith to be more of who God wants me to be? Is there sin to repent of? Is there something you can praise God for? Is there someone you need to forgive, serve or speak to? How are you worshiping God in your life?
