The criticized is not defined by the critic. If Jesus was criticized, you should expect criticism.				
1. Attempts to <u>discredit</u> Jesus' miracles acknowledge that He				
performed them. Matthew12:22-24				
Jesus' critics claimed He had a demon. <i>Mark 3:22</i> Jesus' response - Live with power.				
2. The pursuit of <u>false</u> testimony proves that Jesus' word was				
truth. Matthew 26:14-16; Matthew 26:57-68; Matthew 27:1-5				
Jesus' critics looked for ways to accuse Him. <i>Mark 3:2</i> Jesus' critics tried to trap Him in His words. <i>Matthew 22:15-34</i> Jesus' critics paid people to lie. <i>Matthew 26:14-16; Matthew 27:1-5</i> Jesus' response - Live in truth.				
The only reason someone attempts to prevent a truth to prevail is because they are threatened by that truth.				
3. Attempts to stone Jesus for blasphemy prove He <u>claimed</u> to be				
God. Matthew 26:65; Daniel 7				
Jesus claimed equality with God. John 5:16-18 Jesus claimed to be the 'I AM'. Exodus 3; John 8:58 Jesus claimed to be the Anointed One. Luke 4:16-30 Jesus forgave sin. Luke 5:21; Mark 2:6 Jesus accepts worship. Matthew 8:1; John 9:38; Matthew 14:33 Jesus' response - Live in relationship with God.				
4. Plans to <u>sabotage</u> Jesus' resurrection prove they feared an empty tomb. <i>Matthew 26:62-64</i>
