The four kids of dysfunction:

Hero – super kid, the little parent Scapegoat – troublemaker Loner – the quiet one who flies under the radar Mascot – family or class clown

- A What the loner looks like on the outside:
 - Loner, daydreamer, drifts and floats, quiet, shy, and ignored.
 - Stays off the radar.
 - Isolated, withdrawn from reality.
- **B** What the loner feels on the inside:
 - Unimportant
 - Not allowed to have feelings
 - Hurt
 - Abandoned
 - Defeated
- **C** What the loner means to the family:
 - They offer the family relief.
 - They are the kid no one worries about.
 - They are the good kid.
- **D** As an adult without help:
 - Indecisive, can't say no.
 - Alone, unable to feel, very low self-esteem.
 - Terrified of intimacy, relationship phobia.
- E What the loner can become:
 - Independent, creative, imaginative, resourceful.
